COMMENTS on euthanasia and 'died or lost in shelter care':

May 2009: One cat was euthanized due to advanced bone cancer, was also FIV+. Six kittens 'died or lost in shelter care' were all under 4 weeks of age being bottle fed, with no nursing mother. Five of the 6 were all from the same litter.

July 2009: One cat was euthanized due to probable intestinal lymphoma not responding to treatment, palliative care no longer able to manage condition. This cat was never healthy enough to biopsy for definitive diagnosis. One cat passed away under anesthesia to remove a polyp from soft palate. Two kittens less than 6 weeks of age (from same litter) passed away unexpectedly in foster care.

August 2009: One kitten less than 8 weeks old passed away while receiving treatment for pneumonia.

Sept 2009: One cat was euthanized, advanced stage breast cancer with rapidly deteriorating health, palliative care no longer able to manage condition.

November 2009: One kitten diagnosed with FIP was euthanized at Veterinary Emergency Services. Three other kittens < 8 weeks old died in foster care; one was FeLuk positive; it's sibling appeared healthy and tested negative but had a seizure and died; the third kitten died unexpectedly.

December 2009: One kitten in foster care passed away from panleukopenia.
